

The aim of the Type Rating Instructor TRI(A) A320 training course is to train aircraft license holders to the level of competence defined in EASA FCL.920 and adequate for a TRI.

## Pre-entry requirements

- ▼ Hold an EASA CPL(A) or ATPL(A) pilot license with A320 type rating;
- ▼ Have completed 1500 hours flight time as a pilot on multi-pilot airplanes;
- ₩ Have completed, within the 12 months preceding the date of application, 30 route sectors, including take-offs and landings, as PIC or co-pilot on A320 airplane type, of which 15 sectors may be completed in an FFS representing that type.
